# Fact Sheet

## Community Supervision Agreements

Under community supervision agreements, Aboriginal community councils and other community members are contracted by the Department of Corrective Services to provide a number of services to young offenders in their own communities.

These services include:

- providing monitoring, support and guidance for young people on community based orders coming back to the community after detention or from the court
- providing placement options for young offenders in communities that are not their usual place of residence
- providing placement options for young offenders who may be considered suitable for supervised bail
- having community members approved and trained to provide community conferencing for minor offending
- having community members assist in developing and/or facilitating programs.

The Department provides training and ongoing support to community councils so they can undertake services to an acceptable standard.

These agreements ensure that young people under supervision in the community are more closely monitored. They address the gaps in community justice services available to remote communities due to the vast distances in Western Australia.
